Tom Brandt, JD will speak September 5 (note the date change) to the Catholic Physicians Guild of Dallas on the "Current State of Conscience Protection for Physicians." He will touch on a number of topics including: freedom of religion versus freedom of worship, natural law as a source of conscience protection, the First Amendment as a source of

conscience protection, the Federal Religious Freedom Restoration Act, and the proposed Health Care Conscience Rights Act. Mr. Brandt is a member of the St. Thomas More society, serving as President from 1999-2001. He is a 1985 graduate with a joint degree (J.D./M.P.A.) from the University of Texas Law School and the Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs.

Tom serves as head of the local government and employment law section at Fanning Harper Martinson Brandt & Kutchin, P.C. He has handled significant cases at every level of the state and federal courts, including numerous cases before the appellate courts, the Texas Supreme Court, the United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit, and the United States Supreme Court.

If you plan to attend the event, we ask that you RSVP, which can be done here.


# **Meeting Day and Location Change**
