Deacon Stump Discusses the Ethical Religious Directives

At our last meeting, Deacon Charlie Stump (Director of Pastoral Services for the Diocese) discussed Part 5 of the Ethical Religious Directives: <u>Care of the Seriously Ill and Dying.</u> The directives were published by the USCCB in 2009 as directives for all Catholics in healthcare. Each chapter covers a specific topic of healthcare. In part 5, the narrative revolves around end-of-life care. So Deacon Stump detailed topics discussed in the chapter, such as: the need for informed consent, the moral obligation to use proportionate means of preserving life (and the call to forego disproportionate or extraordinary means), the moral obligation to provide basic hydration (if not "excessively

burdensome to the patient"), and the impermissibility of euthanasia or tissue donation from direct abortions. There are other topics in the chapter. As expected, there was much discussion from all physicians, as most of us had personal experience with many of the issues.
