### Advent Reflection by Fr. MacGuire

At our last meeting Fr. Robert MacGuire of the Cistercian Abby offered an Advent Reflection for the Guild. He spoke about the need for physicians to have an "eye of an eagle, heart of a lion, and the touch of a woman." "Eye of and eagle" - the trait that the physician must be acute in their surveillance, diagnosis, and treatent of disease. "A heart of a lion" - that one must have the strength and compassion in caring for patients. "The touch of a

woman" - the ability to be gentle and tender in our attitude.

He encouraged us to use Advent as a time to "straighten the path for the Lord," by way of meditation and quiet, especially through availing of the sacrament of confession. Through confession we can experience "the floodgates of mercy." Much discussion followed, as the group shared its own personal, spiritual experiences.


