Dr. Behan speaks to the Guild



At our last meeting, Dr. Joseph Behan discussed the conversion of his practice to NFP-only. Dr. Behan initially entered his Ob-Gyn residency being not fully aware of many of the serious moral matters which were a part of the profession of Obstetrics and Gynecology (like most of us who attended medical school). Through many of his experiences during residency and in practice, he encountered issues and people that gradually revealed to him the truth behind the Church teachings on topics of abortion, contraception, and

reproduction. Eventually he learned the true value and metaphysical meaning behind human sexuality.

Dr. Behan decided to convert his practice to an-NFP only office, which created professional and logistical changes. The process provoked a spiritual deepening as well. After his talk, the guild spent much time during the Q&A portion of the meeting discussing many of the practical changes and medical issues this type of practice requires.
