Last meeting: Christian Perspectives on Suffering



This month Dr. Robert Collins discussed <u>Christian Perspectives of Human</u> <u>Suffering</u>. He presented several different views from various traditions explaining reasons for human suffering: human freedom causing suffering, the allowance of suffering for the ultimate goal of good, the inability of humanity to question the divine tolerance of suffering, the realization of virtue through suffering, suffering as a communal effect of sin, the role of God who is not always playing "magician" or "puppetmaster" over the world, the free will of satanic angels who create evil, etc.

Some quotes:

Thomas Aquinas: "The universe would lack good things if all evils were excluded. There would not be the endurance of the martyrs if there were no persecution by tyrants."

Scott Cairns: "I've personally known dozens who have seized this opportunity (of suffering) to become the men and women that they had, in their deepest hearts, long desired to be. It was as if their imminent deaths freed them from petty, distracted lives, and freed them into greater, genuine living—however briefly."

David Hart: "We exist in the long melancholy aftermath of a primordial catastrophe, that this is a broken and wounded world, that cosmic time is the shadow of true time, and that the universe languishes in bondage to 'powers' and 'principalities'—spiritual andterrestrial—alien to God."

Anglican priest John Polkinghorne: "God no more expressly wills the growth of a cancer than he expressly wills the act of a murderer, but he allows both to happen. He is not the puppet master of either men or matter."

Although we may not understand the reason for suffering, the difference for the Christian is that Christ enters into our suffering and allows for redemption within it.

St. Pope John Paul II (Salvici Doloris): "The Redeemer suffered in place of man and for man. Every man has his own share in the Redemption. Each one is also called to share in that suffering through which the Redemption was accomplished. He is called to share in that suffering through which all human suffering has also been redeemed. In bringing about the Redemption through suffering, Christ has also raised human suffering to the level of the Redemption. Thus each man, in his suffering, can also become a sharer in the redemptive suffering of Christ."
