


# Catholic Physicians Guild of Dallas November Newsletter



### **Advent Reflection December 4**

Our next meeting will take place on December 4 at 7 PM at the St. Rita Commons (east of the Narthex of the main sanctuary - use the entrance on the west side of the building). Fr. Michal Markiewicz - parochial vicar of St. Rita - will be providing us his reflections this Advent season.


Father Markiewicz is from the city of Bydgoszcz, a city in the northwest region of Poland. He is the first of two brothers in a traditional but largely non-practicing Catholic family. Initially, Catholicism was only a cultural value. It was not until the catechesis of the *Neocatechumenal Way* that he begun to discover the personal and spiritual value of his Catholic faith. A crucial moment in discerning God's plan for him was during a pilgrimage to the sanctuary of Matemblewo in northern Poland, where the Virgin Mary is venerated as pregnant with Our Lord. It was there that he discovered the call to the priesthood. The irony (or perhaps fate) was that he was ordained a priest at the Cathedral Shrine in Dallas, dedicated to Our Pregnant Lady, the Virgin of Guadalupe!

In high school he was interested in Polish literature and participated in a nationwide competition of literary criticism and received notoriety for his accomplishments, allowing him to enter the finest universities in Poland. At the same time, however, he felt the call to the priesthood was stronger than his secular academic studies. He decided to enter a missionary seminary, and found himself at the Redemptoris Mater Diocesan Seminary in Dallas. He studied philosophy and received his masters at the University of Dallas. He was recently ordained a priest for the Diocese of Dallas on May 16, 2018.




#### **Article on National Conference in Dallas**
