Our Call from Humanae Vitae....

The discussion at our last meeting – led by Bernadette May, RN - highlighted the encyclical [Humanae Vitae](#) ("Of Human Life"). In the encyclical, Pope Paul VI reflects on the significance of being created in the image and likeness of God and the authentic responses to this self-giving love emulated by our Father. We are similarly called to replicate this faithful, sacrificial, unitive love towards one another.

The most intimate calling to this Christ-like love is within the marital act of sexual intercourse as it communicates a complete union of two complementary beings. That which might disrupt this union – such as contraception – would diminish the unitive and procreative significance of the act and also violate its spiritual meaning.

The Church teaches in Humanae Vitae that the will of God is found within the law of the gospel and natural law. It was predicted by Pope Paul VI that once contraception became widespread, there would be an increase in infidelity, relaxation of sexual/moral standards, and the reduction of females to objects of pleasure. He also predicted that "with the help of grace practicing natural methods, it would strengthen marriage by increased attentiveness and communication, drive out selfishness and deepen responsibility." Hence, the divorce rate among Natural Family Planning users is about 2% while its effectiveness among "motivated couples" is 99%.

So the challenge given to physicians is to "continue constant in resolution always to support those lines of action which accord with faith and with right reason" and to become "fully proficient in this difficult field of medical knowledge."

Introducing our chaplain



Fr. Bob Coerver is the Chaplain of the St Rita Dallas Physicians Guild. He is a native of Dallas, raised in St. Thomas Aquinas Parish and is a Jesuit Graduate (Class of '72). Parishioners of St. Rita Catholic Community (including Physician Guild member Dr. Carmen Wilson) returned February 12th from Honduras after completing the 8th annual Medical Mission in Sonaguera, Honduras. The clinic was held for 3 days, serving 661 patients.

The St Rita medical mission is unique in that it works in solidarity with Honduran doctors and nurses who also volunteer to serve the very poor that come from the surrounding mountain communities. The theme of the mission (that included an evangelization team) was “The Eucharist.” Our hope is always to come together as one community with our sister parish working as the body of Christ.
